Award-winning Writer, Actor, and Director, Peter Wick has completed photography of his third feature, titled Rock Paper Scissors.

Rock Paper Scissors has received four grants from Seattle's Northwest Film Forum, including their "Roll Camera" grant, through which the film was shot in high definition on a Panasonic AG-HVX200 camera.

The film stars former "Miss Italy" Roberta Orlandi, in a breakthrough performance, as "Lana," a High School Chemistry teacher, who runs into her first love from years earlier - Marty, played by Wick - the first day of the new school year.

As old passions ignite, trouble erupts in Lana's marriage.

The film delicately blends drama and romantic comedy, in a tour de force of story-telling, based on Wick's original script, which has been called, "elegantly written" by ThinkFilm's Daniel Katz.

Wick has previously won awards for both of his prior feature films.

1999's Long Strange Trip won Wick the "Most Promising Director" Award at the New York Int'l Independent Film Festival, as well as Runner Up for Best film at that year's Long Island Int'l Film Fest.

2008's Movie Pizza Love won Indiefest's Feature Film Award-of-Merit, as well as the Original song award for Jen Casebeer's "Trashy Novel," from the film's soundtrack.

Currently in post production, Rock Paper Scissors looks to be next year's "breakout" independent feature, and will be submitting to festivals this Fall. The film will be seeking a quality distribution agreement, as those close to the film believe strongly in its high creative standard, as well as its commercial potential.
